Garden Party - June 21

The Annual Garden Party will take place on Monday June 21, 2010, at the residence of Pip and Tony Randhawa, 2248 Taylors Orchard. Development

Berkley Homes - Harborn Road/Premium Way/Grange Drive - Provided that the City approves all of the required permits, construction is slated to start in June or July. Berkley has apparently sold about two-thirds of the proposed 18 units.

Ross Property - Parker Dr & Lynchmere Ave - Dave Ross, a long time resident of Parker Drive has informed the Gordon Woods Executive that he is planning to sever his property which fronts onto both Parker Drive and Lynchmere Avenue. The severance would result in seven lots; three lots on Parker Dr instead of two and four lots on Lynchmere Ave. We anticipate the Parker Dr lots will conform to all applicable zoning regulations including the requirement for 100 foot lot frontages. The Lynchmere Ave lot frontages are expected to be about 75 feet which does not conform. There will be a Committee of Adjustment hearing on this application later this Spring.

2160 Gordon Dr - Welcome to the new owners, Herpreet and Ravinder Sohi, who are planning to build a new home, replacing the existing residence formerly owned by the late Dr. Alan McNab. As a first step the Sohis had the health of the trees checked. The resulting arborist report identified trees that were dead or hazardous which had to be removed by order of

the City. A development application for a single family home has been submitted.

Petition

In response to the ongoing issues caused by overflow parking from the Rabba plaza on Grange Drive and in anticipation of the problem getting worse with the upcoming construction of the 7 new homes on Grange Dr, a petition to restrict parking was submitted on behalf of the residents by Jackie Gideon, the Grange Dr street representative. We understand the petition was accepted by the City. The bylaw will prohibit parking on Grange Dr during business hours, Mondays to Fridays.



Mary Fix Creek Erosion

Control

Earlier in April, the City initiated an Environmental Assessment (EA) to examine and propose solutions to an erosion problem in the Mary Fix Creek between Harborn Road and Premium Way. The City will be hosting an open house to present results of their study to interested residents. We will keep you informed when we learn more about this.



Neighborhood Garage Sale

We have decided to give the Neighbourhood Garage Sale a rest for a few years. If you plan to run a garage sale on your own, consider contacting a few of your neighbours to see if you can turn it into a street sale. Let us know, and we may put out an e-mail to the rest of the neighborhood. We however will not publicize a garage sale run by a single property.

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Hurontario LRT

At a Public Information Centre held on March 31, we were introduced to the preferred option of installing a Light Rail Transit (LRT) facility on Hurontario Street to provide for more efficient public transportation along this important corridor. This project is still several years from construction, but when implemented will reduce the number of traffic lanes on Hurontario Street from six to four. The Hurontario LRT is part of the overall Hurontario-Main Street Study. Last summer, the Gordon Woods Homeowners Association submitted a letter of comment about the proposed height of buildings that would be permitted along Hurontario Street and the Hospital property where it adjoins with the Gordon Woods Neighbourhood. In response to our comment, the height will be limited to six storeys instead of twenty.
