### **Garden Party - June 20**

#### **OMB Ross Appeal**

The Ontario Municipal Board has scheduled a 3-day hearing to start on Wednesday May 4 at 10:00 am in the hearing room in the Mississauga Civic Centre, 300 City Centre Drive. The final scheduled day is May 6. Last Spring, Mr. Ross applied to sever his properties which front on both Parker Drive and Lynchmere Avenue into a total of seven lots. The three proposed lots on Parker conform to the zoning whereas the four on Lynchmere do not. The Committee of Adjustment considered the application in October 2010 and denied the proposed severances. Mr. Ross subsequently appealed the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board and the May 4<sup>th</sup> hearing is to consider the appeal. Both the City and area residents expressed concern that the proposed lots would result in an excessive number of trees being removed. The City suggested that Mr. Ross proceed by means of a rezoning application rather than land severance so that an optimal design could be achieved that would strike a balance between tree removal, the character of the neighbourhood and the right of Mr. Ross to develop his property. The Gordon Woods Homeowners Association supports the position of the City and encourages all interested residents to attend.

We have attempted to meet with Councillor Iannicca to discuss this issue but have not yet been able to arrange a date. However we understand that he will be sending a letter to area residents prior to the hearing to state the City's position. We have also learned from Planning staff that the City plans to vigorously defend the position that it took at the Committee of Adjustment Hearing.



#### **Tree By-law**

In July of 2009, a significant number of trees were illegally removed from a lot on Premium Way. Charges were laid under the Tree By-law and a conviction was obtained. Similarly in July 2010, a large number of trees were removed from a Gordon Drive property and again charges were laid under the tree by-law. At the initial trial in October, the case was stayed until May. What these two infractions have demonstrated is that the existing tree bylaw is ineffective at controlling the removal of trees. The GWHA brought its concerns to the MIRANET (Mississauga Ratepayer Association Network) steering committee and discovered that the experience in Gordon Woods was not unique; similar situations had occurred elsewhere in Mississauga. Hence, several other Ratepayer Associations shared the opinion that the existing Tree By-law was broken and needed to be fixed. MIRANET formed a Subcommittee with representation from four different Ratepayer Associations. This Subcommittee drafted a report and discussed it with Councillors Tovey and Mullin at a meeting on April 6. Both Councillors also shared the view that the existing by-law had shortcomings that needed to be addressed. Councillor Mullin moved a motion on April 13 that directs City Staff to study the problem and propose changes to the Tree By-law. The main

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issues identified by the MIRANET draft report are: 4 trees per year is excessive; single large trees require protection; the existing fines are not a deterrent; and tree removal contractors that are employed by the property owner also be made liable to fines, thereby adding an element of self-enforcement.
